Pastor's Corner

Keep What You Have Promised

In all Rock Island Parishes this weekend, we celebrate the First Holy Communion.
Last year, in my bulletin article for Sacred Heart and St. Mary's, I wrote: "I ASK YOU, DEAR PARENTS: PLEASE, your children

receive an unimaginable gift. They have access to God Himself. PLEASE, take care of that." "And, DEAR PARENTS, PLEASE, take care of your children's spiritual life. It's not done yet. Don't think you have done what was needed, and you can have a break until your children receive confirmation. It's just started."

When I was a kid, my mom used to tell me the same thing every month around the first Friday: "The first Friday is this week. Don't forget about the confession." And, then, after the first Friday, she always asked me: "Did you remember to go to confession?" That was when kids were more "free" because they could go to church by themselves and didn't need an adult to drive them there. I was usually walking by myself. Of course, I was an altar server and always somehow close to the church, so someone could say it was natural and obvious for me to take care of such things. But you know, kids and teenagers. It's not so obvious and easy. My mom's "boring" reminders were an essential part of her parenting and my spiritual growth. She knew I needed a reminder; she knew how important it was to stay in God's grace and have this desire to get rid of sin. I knew that I couldn't lie to her that I went to confession because when I was serving at Mass, and I was always serving when I went to church, she could easily see if I received Jesus in the Holy Communion. And I wouldn't ever go to the Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin. I would be too terrified to do such a thing. I am so grateful that I was like that. I am so thankful that my mom took her responsibility seriously doing all those boring, annoying, but important things, comments, and reminders. That's what parents must do. Their job is to prepare children to be independent and responsible; the most crucial thing is the child's soul. When the soul of your child is lost, any other effort is pointless.

The biggest problem nowadays is that even if children receive all possible preparation for the sacraments at school or CCD classes, they are not reminded to continue living their spiritual lives. There is so much neglect on the parent's side afterward. It tears my heart in pieces when I learn that children, after their First Holy Communion, don't go to confession, don't attend Sunday Masses, and conse-

quently don't receive Jesus for months and sometimes years. The children are perfectly cared for when it comes to their sports activities. They are very consistent in all those activities. Their parents drive them to any possible place every single day and on the weekends, except church. Everything is essential except their children's souls.

That's why, brothers and sisters, I ask you today to pray for the parents of our First Communion children. May they continue to be the teachers of faith to their children, as they promised at their children's baptisms.


SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Whenever needed, please call the parish office. Please advise us of persons in the hospital, nursing facilities, or homebound.

Many of you have commented to us on how beautiful the lace cloth is on our communion rail. Here's the backstory on this cloth: we traditionally cover the communion rail from Easter through First Holy Communion. This special cloth was donated to us many years ago by Colleen Huiskamp, who purchased it in Avignon, France. Those of you who are history scholars may remember that Avignon was the home of the papacy from 1309 to 1376. We fondly remember Colleen every year that we use it on our communion rail.

We got things straightened out: You probably have noticed that the gold cross at the peak of our roof has leaned for years. We're happy to report that it is once again standing up straight after some much needed restoration work was completed this past week. Thank you to Pat VanAcker for overseeing this work!

For being 174 years old, our front porch looks pretty good! We completed the repair and painting of the front porch of our rectory/office this week — a much needed improvement! Our rectory/office actually predates the church by atleast 50 years, built in 1850 by hotelier, developer, and one-term mayor, Ben Harper, and known for many years as the Harper House. Per the City of Rock Island, it's the earliest Greek Revival style house in Rock Island — and is perhaps the oldest documented residence in the city limits. We're grateful to finally have this painting completed, just in time for hosting Alleman's Baccalaureate Mass and for Porch Party season! Thank you to everyone who contributes to our Property Improvement Fund, which makes projects like this possible!
