PASTOR'S CORNER

Our Last Chance?

If you watched the movie Seabiscuit, you probably remember a scene at the campfire. Charles, played by Jeff Bridges, decides that he wants to get involved in horse racing and begins looking for a

trainer. When he spots Tom Smith (a washed-up cowboy and trainer, played by Chris Cooper) healing a "good-fornothing" white horse (who had a broken leg he had earlier saved from being "put down"), Charles is intrigued. Coming upon Tom at his campfire one evening, he asks him why he is wasting time on a horse that will never race again. Tom replies: "'Cause I can. Every horse is good for something. He could be a cart horse or a lead pony. And he's still nice to look at. You don't throw a whole life away just 'cause he's banged up a little."

God's forgiveness is the most excellent proof of His almightiness. It is easier to create something new than to fix a broken thing. God doesn't want to destroy what He has made just because it is broken, so He offers all of His almightiness to correct what a man has broken. Forgiveness is a sign of mercy. God forgives because He can. He forgives because that's the only way He can love us when we are sinners and have betrayed Him. God still wants to love, and mercy is the only option. Mercy is God's free choice to love us even though we don't deserve it. So, when He decides to love, His mercy comes as the way of loving.

God didn't give up on us even though it was our fault that our nature was broken and our ways of life were crooked. We misused God's gifts, and we lost lots of them. But because God still loves us, He doesn't give up. He is ready with His mercy to help and save us if we regret our faults and repent and want to change. God is Mercy itself, and He loves even those who turn away from Him. That's why God's mercy is our hope.

What about how Jesus showed the mystery of His mercy to St. Faustina? In her Diary, we read this. In 1933, God gave Sister Faustina a striking vision of His Mercy. Sister tells us: "I saw a great light, with God the Father in the midst of it. I saw Jesus nailed to the cross between this light and the earth so that God, wanting to look upon the earth, had to look through Our Lord's wounds. And I understood that God blessed the earth for the sake of Jesus."

Jesus said to Sister Faustina: "Say unceasingly this chaplet that I have taught you. Anyone who says it will receive great Mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as the last hope. EVEN THE MOST HARDENED SINNER, IF HE RECITES THIS CHAPLET EVEN ONCE, WILL RECEIVE GRACE FROM MY INFINITE MERCY.

I want the whole world to know My Infinite Mercy. I want to give unimaginable graces to those who trust in My Mercy

That means God wants us to understand that He CAN SAVE US, but it is up to us. We must want it! Even the most hardened sinner can be saved IF (!) he recites this prayer not because it has some magical words but because by reciting it, that sinner will admit that Jesus is the only hope. He will admit that he needs salvation and mercy, and Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is the only One through whom he can be saved. That's the proclamation of faith. That's what Jesus requires; that's what God the Father requires because none of us can do more. We all can only admit that Jesus is our salvation. Whatever we do in our religious and spiritual life, we do it as acceptance of God's plan of salvation. That's it. God's mercy is our last chance.






