# Pastor's Corner

#### Long live the King....?

Next Sunday is Lent's last Sunday. We call it Palm Sunday, but the liturgical name is Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion.
That day's liturgy could be confusing or, we could say, full of contradictions. The

Church recalls Christ's entrance into Jerusalem to accomplish His Paschal Mystery. So, we will start our liturgy with the memorial of this entrance of the Lord, but during the Liturgy of the Word at Mass, we will read the Gospel about Jesus' Passion.

There will be "Hosanna to the Son of David" and later "Crucify Him!" We will see two different pictures. People rejoiced and were almost in ecstasy when Jesus came to Jerusalem. Jesus entered that city with all the glory. He didn't deny it; He planned and expected it. We will read Mark's or John's version of that event. We can read the Pharisees' reaction to that situation in Luke's Gospel. "Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, rebuke your disciples.' He said in reply, 'I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out!"

So, the whole city was about praising Jesus as the Messiah. Thinking about that, we realize that those must be the same people who, in a few days, on Friday, will cry out: "Crucify Him!" The same people praised the Lord and were so excited that they didn't care what their religious leaders thought about it, and they shouted despite the Pharisees' disapproval. And the same people on Friday shouted, asking for Jesus's death because of their leaders' (Pharisees, Sadducees, and priests) demand.

Should we judge them for such an unstable and hypocritical attitude? We all know that we shouldn't because we know that we are the same very often. We proclaim our faith, wear our religious symbols, and publicly accept Jesus (which is good and needed, of course). And then, we crucify Him by our sins, in the secrecy of our hearts. We all do that. That's why it is good that the Church reminds us of such a thing on Palm Sunday. It is a reminder that it is so easy to go from the praise and spiritual excitement to sinfulness and betrayal of our Lord. Palm Sunday is the first day of the Holy Week – the week when we celebrate the entire story of salvation. That salvation is needed precisely because of our unstable and crooked nature. Just like the people in Jerusalem, we need the Messiah, the Savior who deserves our praise, because if we don't praise Him, the stones will. We should be grateful that what happened in Jerusalem has impacted all of us over the centuries because we all need God's patient mercy.

Growing Disciples Round 3 Parish Models


Last Sunday, the Diocese of Peoria published the Round 3 Parish Models on the Growing Disciples Pastoral Plan website, and many people have questions about them. So, here is my comment on this, especially for the St. Mary's and Sacred Heart parishioners.

We need to emphasize, as our bishop repeatedly does, that no decisions have been made yet. This Round 3 Plan is a proposal made by the Core Team and the Presbyteral Council after working on the feedback received from all of us. Bishop Tylka will announce his decisions on Pentecost Sunday, May 19th.

As we can see, Round 3 Models have changed since Round 2. All three Rock Island parishes have a common Pastor with the Community of Franciscan Priests working together. All three Rock Island parishes are marked with the letter (P), which means (according to this proposal) they will remain canonically separate parishes (as the primary locations). It says that within three years, this situation will be re-evaluated if the merger of Sacred Heart and St. Mary's and the closing of one of those churches will be needed. I don't think it's needed right now, and I firmly believe it won't be necessary in three years.




