Remembering Jesus' Suffering

In one of my bulletin articles last year, I wrote about the history of the Stations of Cross and the Franciscan influence on bringing this devotion from the Holy Land to Europe and popularizing it. I will not re-

peat the same thing this year, but I can assure you, brothers and sisters, that this tradition of the Catholic Church is very Franciscan. We can see the stations of the cross basically in every Catholic church all over the globe. It became a part of the Catholic way of "equipping" our churches. As stated in my article last year, that tradition came to Europe through the Franciscan influence. In the 1500s and 1600s, Franciscans began to build a series of outdoor shrines across Europe depicting various holy spots along the path Jesus took through Jerusalem. In the 17 th century, they received from the pope the privilege to erect the stations in all Franciscan churches, and indulgence was granted to those who devoutly visited those places and prayed, meditating on the Passion of the Lord. Later on (in the 18th century), this indulgence was permitted in all churches.

So, nowadays, we also can receive A PLENARY INDULGENCE that is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly make the Stations of the Cross.

I know that Franciscan spirituality has often been seen as the spirituality of "easygoing lovers of animals and nature," but that is a total misunderstanding of St. Francis of Assisi and his movement. When we read any text that came from St. Francis, we can see his "stubborn" focus on three main topics: the Incarnation of the Son of God, the Passion and sacrificial death of Jesus on the cross, and the Sacred Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist in all churches around the world.

St. Francis focused his attention on Jesus as a Person.


Most of all, the focus was on Him becoming one of us, which made it possible for Him to sacrifice Himself for us out of unending love. Jesus' Incarnation and Suffering are two marks of God, who walks toward us to meet us on our ground and to take care of us because of our sinfulness. The Lord's presence in the Eucharist is the continuation of this love for us even after Jesus' ascension to heaven.

During Lent, we all should learn from St. Francis the importance of meditating on Jesus's suffering and death. We owe Him, and taking time to reimagine what Jesus suffered to save us is a sign of our love and gratitude. Lent must prepare us for the Resurrection, but the Resurrection wouldn't happen at all if not for Jesus' willingness to suffer

for our sins. That's how we can show our Lord our appreciation and love.

That's why I invite you, brothers and sisters, to attend the Stations of the Cross at our churches during Lent, to make this commitment and give up some time on Fridays to pray and meditate.

Did you Know? Your child can attend a Catholic School & Financial Assistance Is Avail-

able! Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. 


